OPENING QUESTIONS - Use these questions to connect with others in your group:

- 1. What's new and exciting?
- 2. Were you ready for the first snowfall of the year? Did you get any snow?

KEY POINTS - take a minute to review the key points from this weekend's message

- 1. Human nature is to always want more as in the example of the alligator.
- 2. In Paul's message to Timothy, we find that great wealth is contentment.
- 3. To be truly wealthy, Paul tells us to trust in God instead of our wealth and to use our money for the good of others.

SCRIPTURES USED IN THIS MESSAGE: 1 Timothy 6:6, 1 Timothy 6:7-8, 1 Timothy 6:18-19

RESPOND

Talk about a thought, phrase, or moment from this weekend's message that stuck with you. Give a brief reason for why these things stuck with you. When you think of Great Wealth what do you think of?

Talk about a time in your life when you have wrestled with wanting more. What are the upsides and downsides to having more?

Read 1 Timothy 6:6 – What does godliness with great contentment look like in a person's life?

Read 1 Timothy 6:8 - Share an honest reaction to the statement of this verse.

The message suggested 4 ways to be truly wealthy:

- 1. Write down what you are grateful for. Have you ever done this? If so, what was the experience like for you?
- 2. Give something away. What would be some benefits of this practice?
- 3. <u>Leverage your access for the benefit of others.</u> Can you think of access you have had that other people may not have? How could you share that access with others?
- 4. Budget generosity. Brainstorm some ways to budget generosity in your family.

Think about a generous person you know. How have you seen them live with open hands? How have you seen God put that person in a position to give more?

Have you even said this phrase out loud or in your head: "I would give more if I had more." How has this message challenged that type of thinking?

Starting this week, start working through the 4 ways to becoming truly wealthy.
