Opening Question

What stood out to you from the weekend message? Was there a scripture, principle or action step that has stuck with you?

<u>Scripture</u>

Read Hebrews 11:30 & Joshua 5:13-6:21

The Israelites have just crossed the Jordan River and entered the Promised Land. Before them stands the fortified city of Jericho. The Lord then proceeds to give them the city but in a very unusual way.

- How do you think the Israelites felt about Joshua's battle plan?
- What do you think was the purpose of the trumpet blast and the people's shout?
- Why did God call for the total destruction of Jericho?
- Can you think of a personal lesson that can you apply from this story? If you need help, consider these questions:
 - What wall are you currently facing?
 - What have you found that is helpful in breaking down walls?

Read Joshua 24:1-27

- Why do you think Joshua recounts Israel's history?
- After all they have been through, why do you think the Israelites were given a choice now about who to serve?

Conclude this study with this exercise to reflect on how God has shown faithfulness to you:

- Share something that God has done for you and/or your family
- Write down a concrete spiritual commitment you want to make in response to God's faithfulness
- Write down on paper something you are putting ahead of God in your life
